

ORDINANCE NO. 2673

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING NEW OPEN BURNING REGULATIONS, REPEALING AND REPLACING ORDINANCE NO. 1571, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, The Dennison Fire Chief has advised Council Members of the Village of Dennison, Ohio of his concern that the current ordinance regarding open burning (Ordinance No. 1571, which was passed on May 18, 1971) is not in conformity with current Ohio law regarding open burning,; and

WHEREAS, Council Members of the Village of Dennison, Ohio find that it is necessary to establish new, updated regulations regarding open burning in the Village of Dennison, Ohio.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF DENNISON, OHIO AS FOLLOWS:

- SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 1571, which was passed on May 18, 1971, is hereby repealed and replaced with the within Ordinance.
- SECTION 2. Open burning shall be regulated pursuant to the requirements and restrictions as listed in Ohio Administrative Code Chapter 1301:7-7-03, Section 307, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A", with the exception that the use of portable outdoor fireplaces are not permitted in the Village of Dennison.
- SECTION 3. For bonfires and recreational fires, only clean, seasoned fire wood or its equivalent may be used.
- SECTION 4. In accordance with regulations promulgated by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources, Division of Forestry, open burning is strictly prohibited from 6:00 AM to 6:00 PM during the months of March, April, May, October and November.
- SECTION 5. No open burning or in a container of any type, kind, or nature shall be permitted on the pavement of any street or roadway within the Village of Dennison. No open burning shall be permitted in the alleys of the Village of Dennison.
- SECTION 6. The use of a burn barrel of any type is strictly prohibited in the Village of Dennison.
- SECTION 7. No structures, including but not limited to wood barns, homes, garages, and out buildings, may be burned, and no materials from demolished structures may be burned.
