

ORDINANCE NO. 2618

**AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING SEVENTY-TWO (72) HOUR PARKING
ON THE STREETS AND ROADWAYS LOCATED IN THE VILLAGE OF
DENNISON, OHIO, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Dennison, Ohio has reviewed issues involving parking of motor vehicles along the streets and roadways located in the Village of Dennison, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Dennison, Ohio, after such review, has determined that there is currently a need to regulate the parking of motor vehicle on the streets and roadways located in the Village of Dennison, Ohio, and to amend previously adopted legislation regarding the parking of motor vehicles on the streets and roadways located in the Village of Dennison, Ohio.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF DENNISON, OHIO AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. No person shall stop or park a motor vehicle, except in compliance with the directions of a law enforcement officer, for a period of longer than seventy-two (72) hours on the streets and roadways located in the Village of Dennison, Ohio.

SECTION 2. A person violating this Ordinance, on the first violation, shall be assessed a fine of Five Dollars (\$5.00).

SECTION 3. Each subsequent violation of this Ordinance shall result in a fine of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00).

SECTION 4. Upon a violation of the within ordinance, the Police Department of the Village of Dennison, Ohio shall have the authority and discretion to cause the towing of an illegally parked vehicle, and the vehicle owner shall be solely responsible for the towing expense.

SECTION 5. The foregoing Ordinance was adopted and all actions and deliberations of the Village of Dennison, Tuscarawas County, Ohio relating thereto were conducted in open meetings to the public in compliance with all applicable legal requirements including Sections 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 6. This ordinance is hereby deemed to be an emergency to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of Dennison, Ohio and shall go into full force and effect on the first day after its passage by the Village Council as an emergency measure provided it receives the necessary votes.
