ORDINANCE NO. 1571

AN ORDINANCE HAVING FOR ITS PURPOSE THE PROHIBITING OF BURNING OF TRASH WHICH WOULD CAUSE OFFENSIVE SMOKE OR NOXIOUS ODORS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF DENNISON

Section 1. No person, partnership, company, or corporation or his or their agent, representative or employee shall ignite, burn, or cause to be burned any refuse, trash, garbage, or any other substance which will cause or result in the omission of any noxious or offensive smoke or odor.

Section 2. The burning of paper and cardboard will be permitted out of doors in a container, said container shall be situated a minimum of ten (10) feet from any inhabited dwelling or place of business. A minimum space of five (5) feet is required between said container and any other combustible building material, pole, tree, or shrubbery. The burning of such material shall not endanger the health, safety, or welfare of another, or endanger his property.

Section 3. Burning as stated in Section 2 will be permitted between the hours of 4 PM and 7:30 PM Monday thru Saturday. No burning shall be permitted on Sundays or Legal Holidays.

Section 4. No burning of any nature will be permitted when wind velocity or other weather conditions might carry fly ash or sparks to adjoining properties or endanger the burner's property, even though he complies with distance requirements in Section 2.

Section 5. Open fires, such as campfires, barbeques, charcoal grills, and cook-outs shall be permitted for recreational purposes.

Section 6. No open burning or in a container of any type, kind, or nature shall be permitted on the pavement of any street or roadway within the village. No open burning shall be permitted in the alleys of the village.

Section 7. Leaves, brush, tree limbs, or materials of this nature may be burned either in a container or open fire in a designated place and with permission of the Fire Chief or his representative, namely the fireman on duty, said fire shall not endanger burner's property nor that of his neighbors property, electrical or telephone wires, or be in line with any low hanging tree limbs or other combustible materials.

Section 8. Whoever shall violate any part or parts of this ordinance shall be fined not less than twenty (\$20.00) dollars nor more than Fifty (\$50.00) for each offense.

Section 9. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village of Dennison, Ohio and shall take effect and be in force at the earliest period allowed by law.
