

## ORDINANCE NO. 1850

**AN ORDINANCE LEVYING A TAX OF FIVE DOLLARS AND NO/100 (\$5.00) PER MOTOR VEHICLE FOR EACH MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTERED IN THE VILLAGE OF DENNISON, OHIO FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING, MAINTAINING, AND REPAIRING THE ROADS; FOR PURCHASING, ERECTING, AND MAINTAINING TRAFFIC SIGNS AND MARKERS, AND FOR SUCH OTHER PURPOSES AS ALLOWED BY LAW.**

WHEREAS, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED BY THE VILLAGE OF DENNISON, OHIO:

### SECTION 1.

A Tax in an amount of Five Dollars and no/100 (\$5.00) is hereby levied for each motor vehicle, including automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, motor powered recreational vehicles, motor homes, or any other motor powered vehicle, the district of registration of which, as defined in section 4503.10 of the Revised Code, is within the corporation limits of the Village of Dennison.

### SECTION 2.

The proceeds of the tax as levied in Section 1 above shall be paid into the treasurer's office of the Village of Dennison, Ohio, by the County Auditor pursuant to section 4504.07 of the Ohio Revised Code.

### SECTION 3.

The funds raised from the levy of the tax shall be used for the purpose of paying the costs and expenses of enforcing and administering the tax provided for in this section; and for planning, constructing, improving, maintaining, and repairing public roads, highways, and streets; maintaining and repairing bridges and viaducts; paying the municipal corporation's portion of the costs and expenses of improvement, and construction of state highways; paying the municipal corporation's portion of the compensation, damages, cost, and expenses of planning, constructing, reconstructing, improving, maintaining, and repairing roads and streets; paying any costs apportioned to the municipal corporation under section 4907.47 of the Revised Code; paying debt service charges on notes or bonds of the municipal corporation issued for such purposes; purchasing, erecting, and maintaining street and traffic signs and markers; purchasing, erecting and maintaining traffic lights and signals; and to supplement revenue already available for such purposes.

### SECTION 4.

This ordinance shall become effective on the earliest date allowed by law.
