

ORDINANCE NO. 2130

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE MAXIMUM LOADS OF
VEHICLES ON THE STREETS AND ALLEYS OF THE
VILLAGE OF DENNISON**

WHEREAS, the Village of Dennison desires to regulate the operation and parking of large vehicles on the public streets and alleys for the general benefit, convenience and comfort of residences and businesses of the community.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Dennison, County of Tuscarawas, State of Ohio as follows:

SECTION 1. That except as set forth in Section 2, no vehicle with a gross weight in excess of five (5) tons shall be operated or parked on the Village streets and alleys.

SECTION 2. That the only exception to the foregoing gross load limit of Section 1 is that it shall be lawful to make actual pickup and delivery of any load or part of load to a destination on any street in the Village of Dennison when the operator of the vehicle has in his possession a bonafide delivery bill or similar evidence for such pick-up or delivery. Nothing herein shall be interpreted to prohibit vehicles from leaving or returning to their headquarters, terminals or parking lots which shall not be a residential property if said vehicle is not in excess of legal load limits specified by the State Department of Highways.

SECTION 3. That vehicles with a gross weight in excess of five (5) tons not making actual delivery of any part thereof within the Village and entering the Village on a State Route or after entering a State Route shall not leave a State Route in passing through unless directed to do so by reason of a detour or similar sign.

SECTION 4. A violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$50.00 plus costs of prosecution.
